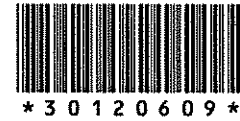

You have been reading *Girl With A Pearl Earring* in your English class. Your tutor has asked you to write an essay on Griet's relationship with two of the Vermeer sisters, Cornelia and Maertge. Describe the characters of the two girls and explain the role each girl plays in the course of Griet's life.

- (b) Rose Tremain: *The Way I Found Her*

A literary magazine has recently featured an article on novels that have a teenager as the narrator. You decide to write a letter to the magazine about Lewis in *The Way I Found Her*. In your letter, you should describe two or three events in which the reader sees the world through Lewis's eyes, and explain whether you think the novel is more or less enjoyable because he is telling the story.
